


Answer at the back of the pack





Make these glasses as colourful as you can by using your brightest crayons. The brightest glasses will be chosen as the winner. Good Luck!






Get the group sitting on the floor. Group leader to prepare a tray of items and place a tea towel over the tray. Blindfold one child and ask them to find specific items on the tray. The leader can only describe the item and not say the name of the object. The child can only use listening skills and the feel of touch to find the specific object. Do not use sharp objects or anything that people could injure themselves with.




Beacon BRIGHT BRIGHT Blindfold 'Circle of silence game'


Great with groups of around 10 to 20. Group to stand in an inward facing circle with an arms length between each person. One person is given an object that if jarred will make a noise, a large tin with a few marbles in it works really well. The tin must be passed from one person to the next as quietly as they can. One of the group wears a blindfold and asked to stand in the middle of the circle. Their aim is to listen out for the noise of the tin and marbles. If they hear it they should point to where the noise comes from. Whoever made the noise takes the place of the person in the middle of the group.
